Social Learning in Borderline Personality Disorder

Borderline personality disorder (BPD) is a serious mental illness with high community prevalence that increases risk for chronic distress and disability and for suicide attempts. People with BPD suffer from profound difficulties in social cognition that are directly associated with these poor outcomes. However, the neurobiology of social difficulties in BPD is poorly understood, in part due to the profound heterogeneity in the BPD population. In this seminar, Dr. Fineberg will describe work to test the role of aberrant social learning in BPD from both categorical (BPD vs healthy control and other psychiatric disorders) and dimensional (across the range of intensities for relevant symptom domains) perspectives.
